WATCH In Review

What a year it has been at WATCH, a year like no other we have ever experienced.

The Corona Virus has been a devastating pandemic that saw all of us in and out of lockdown and Government restrictions enforced upon us.

Our absolute priority was always the safety and wellbeing of participants and the WATCH team and we would like to sincerely thank you all for your flexibility and patience throughout the year.

Some of the ways WATCH has kept you safe in 2020 and will continue to do so in 2021 are:

- Taking Temperature of all attendees entering the centre
- No attendee will enter if temperature is over 37.5 degrees
- Any symptoms: cough, temperature, tired/fatigued, runny nose, sneezing, Sore throat must stay home and recommendation is to get tested.
- All Staff are to wear face masks.
- Smaller groups across three buildings (In 2021 this will change back to our regular timetable)
- Limits of people gathering together in a space is displayed in all rooms
- All attendees at the service to wash their hands upon entering the service.
- Making available hand sanitiser and tissues.
- Appropriate and Easy to Read Signage placed around WATCH
- Where possible use alternative modes of contact (i.e. phone or email) to reduce person-to-person contact.
- Reducing periods of face-to-face contact where possible.
- Implementing at least 1.5 metres space between people where possible.
- No outside patrons/services are to enter Watch unless absolutely necessary (This restrictions is beginning to lift)
- From November 2020, Necessary services for a person's support can be provided in restricted areas, however, alternative methods of contact should be used where possible.
- All staff have had Covid-19 Infection Control training
- Increasing daily cleaning during and after programs
- All staff will abide by Government restrictions
- A Covid Safe Plan is in place and will continually be reviewed.

We look forward to connecting with you all in 2021 as we return to group based activities and continue to support better choice, better participation and continuous improvement.

We wish all our participants and supporters a very safe and festive season.

CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT MESSAGE

Without a doubt the year 2020 has proven most difficult for WATCH's clients, parents, carers, helpers and staff. Covid 19 has placed an enormous strain on us all.

Our Mulgrave and Springvale campuses have had to close for two lengthy periods. Then, when they did reopen, many chose not to attend due to virus related concerns.

Fortunately we have been able to retain our dedicated staff throughout this although doing so has meant for them a reduction in income. Fortunately WATCH has been able to alleviate some of this burden through the Federal Government Jobkeeper Scheme supplementing the considerably reduced NDIS payments. It has not been easy.

On top of this we have all had to make sacrifices in order to comply with measures put in place by the authorities to eliminate the spread of the virus. The uncertainty has had a big impact.
